

HOW YOU'RE HELPING GORILLAS

Your mobile phone may contain a mineral called coltan. Coltan is mined in locations including critical habitat for Eastern Lowland Gorillas in Central Africa. The threats gorillas face as a result of mining include:

- Deforestation Mining leads to habitat loss and habitat fragmentation, reducing areas where gorillas can survive.
- As a result of habitat loss, gorillas come into contact more frequently with humans, increasing likelihood of competition for space or resources.
- Disease With increased human activity, gorillas have increased exposure to human illnesses, such as the flu, some of which can be fatal.

When you recycle your phones there are a number of environmental benefits:

- Your phone will be saved from landfill, with some or all components able to be recycled or re-used.
- + By recycling through this program, you also raise important funds for gorilla conservation. This program supports the Gorilla Doctors, which helps treat ill and injured gorillas in Africa.
