

# ONSITE LEARNING GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS

## Westmeadows Primary School



If your child has been approved to attend Onsite Learning at Westmeadows Primary School, please read the following guide carefully to ensure you are very clear about the implementation of this supervision.

**Please note that attending school onsite in Term 3, 2021 is not available to families as a matter of choice. If your work circumstances change, please withdraw your child.**

In this current crisis, the health and safety of your children and the WPS staff is first and foremost, and for this reason the Victorian Government have very clearly stipulated that children who can be at home, **must** be at home.

### Arrival/Pick Up

- Parents/Carers are to drop off and collect their students in the Shadforth Street - 2 Minute Zone.  
Parents are not to enter the school grounds.
- The child will be met at the gate and his/her attendance recorded.
- The child is to go directly to their allocated classroom (they will be told this at the gate)
- Onsite Supervision will commence at **8.50am**. The gate will be opened at this time.
- Onsite supervision will conclude at **3.30pm**. Children will be ready to be collected at the Shadforth Street pick up zone.

### What Does Your Child Need to Bring

- Students will be required to bring ALL learning materials/equipment to school daily (this includes the Home Learning Pack provided at the end of Term 1, 2020).
- Headphones
- Children will not be allowed to go to their normal classroom to retrieve any supplies.
- Snacks and lunch – THE CANTEEN WILL NOT BE OPERATING DURING TERM 2
- Water bottle.
- Social-distancing expectations will also apply during break times.

### Management of an unwell child

- Children experiencing compatible symptoms with coronavirus (COVID-19), such as fever, cough or sore throat must be collected by a parent/guardian or arrangements made to have the child collected as soon as possible.
- If children become unwell whilst at school, their temperature will be taken.
- If your child has a health care plan (i.e. asthma, anaphylaxis, epilepsy, diabetes) you must ensure that these are up-to-date with additional advice, as required, on monitoring and identification of the unwell child in the context of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.
